

About Valley Transit:

Valley Transit is the city bus. Anyone can use the bus; it is open for all the public. It costs \$2.00 one-way for adults and \$4.00 for a day pass, for unlimited rides all day.

Valley Transit’s Appleton Transit Center

100 E Washington St, Appleton. Next to the Appleton Public Library

The Transit Center is the main bus station. It is a building with bathrooms, a waiting area, security and access to Valley Transit staff. Most people come here to wait for their bus or to transfer buses during their trip.

Hours: 5:45am – 6:30pm Monday through Friday
 7:45am – 1:30pm Saturday

Bus Basics:

1. The first bus leaves our **Appleton Transit Center** at 5:45am Monday – Friday, and 7:45am Saturday.

2. Each bus route leaves the Transit Center one time each hour.

Some bus routes leave at 15 minutes after the hour (ex: 1:15pm) and other routes leave at 45 minutes after the hour (ex: 1:45pm).

3. If you are going to the Transit Center and need to transfer to a second bus, you will have a direct transfer with no wait, or will wait 30 minutes for your bus to arrive.

If your first bus is late, the driver will make an announcement and it is important to **tell the driver which bus you want to transfer to** at the Transit Center. The driver can call ahead to have the next driver wait for you.

4. Each Valley Transit bus follows a unique route. All routes end back at the Transit or Transfer Center.

If you stay on any Valley Transit bus, you will return to one of these Centers.

Bus Fare:

- Use cash (bills or coins) or pre-purchased bus tickets on the bus.
- No change is given, but the driver can print you a “change ticket” to use for future bus fare.
- You can purchase multi-day passes with cash in our Transit Center at the Ticket Machine, or with cash or a credit or debit card at some ticket outlets.

Transfer Tickets:

If you pay a one-way fare, but need to transfer and go on a second bus to get to your destination, you need a **transfer ticket**.

1. Pay for your fare.
2. Ask the driver for a yellow **transfer ticket** after you pay.
3. Use the **transfer ticket** as your ticket and proof of payment on the next bus.

The **transfer ticket** is proof that you already paid and are still traveling to your destination. It can only be used once, and will expire if not used.
